League business

It has been another extremely busy year for the League Management Committee (LMC) and several topics have been discussed. After two seasons where COVID has meant that we have had to cut short the league it was nice to look forward to a full season. COVID still has had an impact throughout the season but it's a testament to the hard work of all the LMC that we have finished the season.

If you ever wondered who is responsible for organising fixtures, moving games at the last minute, coping with the bad weather, moving league games due to cup games or COVID then the man who is responsible for this is **Eric Owen** (right). Eric deserves our huge thanks as without his outstanding work we would not be able to play any matches or finished the season

This season we lost our Referees Secretary **Daryl Ann** to the AFA. It's testament to the team setup that the assistant referee secretary, **Mark Freedman** stepped up to the plate and along with his Referees Support Group which includes **Ronnie Robinson**, **Eric Owen**, **Steve Martin-Lawrence** (below) and **Dwane Uylett** they continued the good work. They have had to deal with a shortage of referees across the AFA, so it has been a tough season. While I am here, I would like to go on record to thank Daryl for his hard work as Referee Secretary of the SAL. He is not going away, though, and will continue to serve on the LMC.

Player registration is now engrained in our football now but the work that goes on in the background is huge, add to this we have once again had problems with WGS and the FA Match Day App. This is on top of assisting our clubs to ensure that all of their players are registered, and you can imagine how much time and effort our Registration Secretary **Steve Martin-Lawrence** has put into the role. Steve has now got a registration team behind him which is made up of **Shaun O'Sullivan**, **George Stamp** and **Sachin Patel** which has eased some of his workload. Steve and his team have made great progress to make the process simple and clear but there are still several clubs who are falling foul of this, and Steve must have patience of a saint as he is always available to assist clubs with any queries they may have. It cannot be underestimated the huge effort that Steve has put into this role. Steve's standing at the FA is now so high that he is their unofficial consultant on all matters relating to player registration and the match day app. The LMC's sincere thanks go to Steve and his team for their hard work this season.

The role ensuring the League's finances has once again fallen to **Jonathan Leese** (left). The job of balancing the books is not getting easier and the fact the cost to our clubs is kept to a minimum is testament to Jonathan's hard work. This job has not been made any easier due to two COVID hit seasons. The League does not survive on fines like some do, so Jonathan has to balance the books to ensure the League's financial future is healthy. Thanks must also go our auditor **Jim Conroy** who ensures that that everything is above board.

Our Assistant Treasurer and Sponsorship Secretary, **Martin Barlow** has been busy this year continuing to find new partnerships for the league and keeping an eye on fine payments. Finding a new partner is not an easy job in the post COVID world. A big thank you to you both!

Martin is also Chair of the Cup Committee, and it his role to ensure the SAL Challenge Cups are run smoothly. With the backing of the Cup Committee Martin's hard work has ensured that all ten competitions and finals have run smoothly again this year. Martin deserves huge credit for this. I have to add my thanks to all clubs who have volunteered their grounds to host these cup finals.

The SAL puts an emphasis on good behaviour and sportsmanship. The job of keeping tabs on discipline sits with our discipline officer **Ronnie Robinson**. Ronnie has made the job more professional and the fact and figures available to the LMC detailing discipline across the league is of the highest standard. Rather than hammering clubs Ronnie works with clubs to ensure any potential issues are picked up on and gives clubs all the assistance required to ensure that the clubs have a robust discipline process in place.

The pinnacle of achievement for all players is to represent the League. Since 2001 the task of managing the representative team has fallen to **Bob Leeds**. His tenure has included several extended runs in the FA Inter-League Cup, including trips to Guernsey, Jersey and the Isle of Man, peaking with victory in the 2007-08 edition where the team beat the Midland Combination on penalties at Coventry and went on to represent England at the UEFA Regions Cup in Italy in October 2008. This season Bob has finally taken the decision to stand down and make way for new blood. I would like to thank Bob for commitment to the team and the League over the years. Replacing Bob will be **Dominic Roberts** of Old Blues who will be assisted by **Pat Folan** and Nottsborough's **Dave Hallam**.

The rest of the League Management Committee deserves my thanks for their contributions to the SAL this season. **Jim Kellett** who keep an eye on the rules to ensure they are up to date, **Russell D'Urso**, **Ian Kerr**, **John Doe** and **Eddie Bow** who has organised tonight's dinner. Eddie gave us a scare a few weeks ago when he collapsed on the pitch whilst refereeing a game at Old Parks, but I am pleased to say he has recovered fully and recently signed a new 10-year contract with the club. All members of the LMC have responsibilities with their clubs and the AFA so you can imagine how much effort they put in on behalf of the SAL.

The next few people deserve my personal thanks the **Nick Hamilton** (Chairman), **Martin Barlow** (Vice Chairman), **Shaun O'Sullivan** (Assistant Secretary), **Bob Leeds**, **Colin Ferris**, **John Miller** and my predecessor **Graeme Wilson**. Their support and guidance over the past season have been hugely appreciated.

Another season completed and so much has happened, most of which is not included in my report. To all those volunteers out that contribute to the SAL football experience – thank you. It does not always go well but without you the SAL would not be in as strong a position as it finds itself.

There are a lot of external interests for players and playing football on a Saturday is not always a top priority for some. The last two years have shown us that football is not the most important thing in life, but it does help with fostering long friendships and being part of a team. We have spent a lot of the last two years at home so please support you club and teammates. Those of you here tonight take a minute to think about the club you play for. Can you make yourselves available more often? Can you help with the admin? Is there anyone you know who would like to get involved in your club?

Being part of a team offers you much more than the ninety minutes on a Saturday; don't take it for granted!

Season Review

After the last two season which were affected, it was brilliant to get the season finished. Here is the season review for the SAL.

Senior Section

The League championship race went to the last weeks of the season with **West Wickham** and **Nottsborough** fighting it out all season. In the end West Wickham beat Nottsborough in the title decider in April which was part of an 11-match winning run on their way to clinching their 12th SAL championship. Nottsborough deserve credit for taking the race to the final weeks. At the bottom **Winchmore Hill's** long residency in Senior 1 came to end as they were relegated. Let's hope for a speedy return for the boys from the Hill.

The Senior Division 2 title was an exciting race with several teams in with a chance of finishing in the top two positions. Eventually it was the long-term leaders **The Warren** and **Civil Service** fighting it out for the title. Four straight wins towards the end of the season saw Civil secure the title. A special mention to The Warren who were top for a long time only to miss out, but promotion must still be considered a success. At the bottom **Merton** and **Crouch End Vampires** drop to Senior Division 3 after tough seasons for both.

The race for the Senior Division 3 title and promotion were exciting affairs. **Hammersmith** were the standout team and, with a record of just one loss since the start of November, they powered their way to their first SAL accolade. A massive congratulations for one of the newer clubs in the SAL.

Who would go up with up with them was not as simple, with **Old Blues** pipping **Ibis Eagles** and **Weirside Rangers** to the second spot. A word for **Chattan** who, in their first season with us, had a tough year but enjoyed every minute of it. Feedback from referees told me that they enjoyed their football despite not getting the glory. Clubs like them are a credit to the League.

Intermediate Section

Intermediate Division 1 saw **Nottsborough Res** stay unbeaten all season, dropping only eight points on their way to a dominant title win which is a superb achievement from the Tolworth outfit. Intermediate Division 2 saw a cracking end to the season with **Actonians Association Res** winning the league by 1 point from **Wichmore Hill 3rd**, the latter denying **City of London** the title by beating them in the final game of the season.

Old Owens 3rd dominated Intermediate Division 3 with an 8-match winning streak towards the end of the season helping them to the title ahead of **Alleyn Old Boys 3rd** while in Intermediate Division 4 several sides pulled out at the start of the season leaving a 6-team Division with each team playing each other three times. **Merton 3rd** were the champions.

Junior Section (North)

Junior Division 1 North saw **Norsemen 5th** win the title. One defeat in their last ten games saw them clinch the honours ahead of **Winchmore Hill 4th**.

St. James' Old Boys stormed to the title in Junior Division 2 North, completing a 'double' by also lifting the SAL Minor Cup. They were the stand-out team in the division, remaining unbeaten all season and only dropping 4 points.

The Junior Division 3 North title went down to the last game of the season with **Old Owens 5th** and **Winchmore Hill 6th** vying for the top spot. Owens won their final game of the season to pip Winchmore to the title and make up for losing the SAL Senior Novets Cup final to them earlier in the season.

Norsemen 7th completed a remarkable 'treble', remaining unbeaten in Junior Division 4A North and only dropping 6 points on their way to a convincing title win while another unbeaten season saw **Crouch End Vampires 4th** take the Junior Division 4B North title.

Junior Section (South)

In Junior Division 1 South **Actonians Association 4th** took the silverware following a 10-match unbeaten run from the 27 January helping them to the top spot ahead of **West Wickham 4th**. **Bank of England 3rd** took the Junior Division 2 South title with a strong second half of the season including a 10-match winning run. Junior Division 3 South saw for **Bank of England 4th** dominate the division and a 5-match winning streak in the run-in saw them take the title ahead of **Old Wilsonians 5th** and **Carshalton 3rd**.

Junior Division 4 South was a 2-horse race between **Carshalton 4th** and **Actonians 7th**. Their winner takes all game on 7 May saw Carshalton 4th win and take the title. In Junior Division 5 South **Carshalton 4th** pipped **Polytechnic 8th** to the title with their double header on 9 April being pivotal. Junior Division 6 South saw **Old Wimbledonians Res**, win their first SAL honours in their first season with us. One loss in their last 16 games helped them over the line.

Veterans Section

The race for Vets League 1 North was so close that it hasn't even finished! It has been agreed that the final game of the season between London Lions Vets A and Southgate Olympic Vets will take place at the start of next season. A win for Southgate would hand them the championship; any other result would see Lions win out.

In Vets League 2 North **London Lions Vets B** won by the closest of margins winning the title on goal difference from **Old Minchendenians Vets**.

Champions in the south were **Livingstone RARA Vets** who remained unbeaten on their way to the title and were worth champions after the disappointment of losing the Vets Senior Cup final to **Old Meadonians Vets**.

A huge congratulations to all our winners!

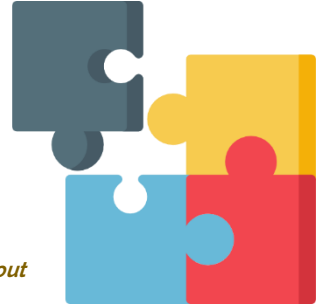
The Giant Jigsaw

The Ideas Factory

This year sees me enter my fifth year as Chair of the League Development Committee. I must admit that I was something of a reluctant candidate for this, and it did take a bit of persuasion from a couple of Management Committee members for me to take it on.

LDC is an essential and important part of the SAL. Primarily it is the "**ideas factory**" of how the SAL can develop and improve, but more than that it looks into each "topic" in depth to ensure that it is the right thing for the League, and that the logistics and organisation is in place to make it work.

During my time, there have been several topics that have been debated, discussed and brought to fruition. Probably the biggest success has been the **Vets League**. This was an idea that was first mooted at LDC, but it was mainly the hard work and commitment of one member, **Graeme Wilson**, that got it established and evolved into the competition it is today. And that is the key, it can just be one person with the support of others or a collective of individuals that can bring an idea to reality. Other "ideas" that have been brought through are the "**LMC Club Mentor Scheme**", whereby clubs have access to an LMC mentor who they can turn to for advice or assistance when needed, the "**Club Administration Dashboard**" which provides LMC members data and early warning of any potential problems within the League, and the **Club Dashboard** which has ensured that all the data we collect is collated efficiently and provides information for both the League and clubs alike. Projects we are bringing through include the "**new club guide**" which we hope will have its first edition this summer, and that we hope will also be of use to existing clubs.

So **where do our "topics" come from?** Some come from the League Management Committee, some from LDC members themselves, and many from players, referees and club officials through the surveys and forums that are generated by the LDC and the League or received directly by us. Every comment or idea that comes back through those forums is looked at, linked with others where need, evaluated, recorded, and discussed, so nothing is missed

The most significant impact that I have had is on the structure of the group. When I first took over, my first task was to organise all the ideas into a "**Topic Bible**" to ensure we had a view of everything that comes our way. Our football always evolves and what might be a "non-starter" now might become a "key project" in the future. Next, I made sure that we linked into all other SAL sub-committees (Match Secretary, Registration Team, Referees Team etc.) as well as LMC so everything is correctly evaluated.

More recently, I became aware that we have over 70 "topics" on our books – far too many and wide ranging for one committee to deal with. As such, we are now addressing such Topics through 3 sub-committees (together with the Referees Team and Registration Team for their specifics), who report into LDC who then submit proposals to the League Management Committee. Those Committees are as follows:

LDCT (Technology)	FA and other systems, Communication tools, social media, Branding, FA Pilots
LDCE (Engagement)	Surveys, Forums, New Clubs, Marketing & Sponsorship, Mentoring, Mental Health
LDCM (Matchday)	Players' initiatives, Club initiatives, amenities and pitches, rule amendment ideas, administration, "New Football" (Walking, Flexi, Midweek etc.)

None of this could happen without the enthusiasm and commitment of the current LDC. My job as Chair is very easy because of the calibre and mix of the current LDC members, and to them I would just say "Thank You". **We always welcome new blood onto the committee**, and especially now that we have more focussed Groups. If Clubs have members who they believe would wish to be part of or contribute to the above groups, please let me know and I will make it happen. **All of our sub-committees meet via Zoom and there is no requirement to also be part of the main LDC Committee if prohibitive.**

SAL Club Dashboard

Over the past couple of seasons LDC has been developing a "Club Dashboard" where we have tried to harness all the data collected through Referees reports and Full-Time data to bring meaningful reporting to both the League and to the clubs themselves. I believe we have finally succeeded in this and are now able to bring regular reporting at all levels (League, club, team) throughout the season. As a League we are grateful to **Steve Rawlinson** and the Development of **Ref Sec**, which collects the Referees data and can import the club data to give us a full database to use.

At a League level, the data is essential to provide the data for awarding the **Hamilton Trophy** (based on Referee marks), and for providing "early warning indicators" for any potential problems or issues. This year for the AGM we have been able to produce high level tables at club level. They are provided for information only, so that clubs can see how they are marked and, if they wish, act where needed for next season. Clubs can also receive (on request) a comprehensive club report giving data at team level.

For this article, I wanted to give some recognition to clubs that have achieved high marks in the various attributes. The great thing for me this season is that there is a mix of the more established clubs, but also some of the newer SAL clubs, showing that they have embraced the ethics and spirit of the league.

Huge congratulations, therefore, to **Cambridge Heath**, winners of this year's Hamilton Trophy. This is an award based on Referee marks and comments, and over the season, **Cambridge Heath** have led the referee ratings on hospitality (even more remarkable given they use a local pub rather than a traditional clubhouse) and sportsmanship, as well as scoring highly on organisation and meet and greet. Including club marks as well, they are top of the tree when looking at the marks for all the social elements, so a great overall performance.

Taking club marks into account as well, **Old Owens** lead the way on hospitality overall, as well as scoring highly on organisation.

One of the referee marks is for sociability which looks at the "sociability" of teams away from home. Congratulations to one of our newest clubs, **Chattan**, who were the top club in this respect, and pleasing to see them embrace the ideals of the League.

With my club chairman hat on, I am proud that **The Warren** are top of the tree for both "meet and greet" and organisation. There are other marks where I can see we have work to do, but happy to take the plaudits for these two at least!

The top marks for sportsmanship also went to another one of our newer clubs Hammersmith

Bank of England rated best for facilities, with **HSBC** and **Richmond & Kew** closely behind

Centurions



One of the strengths of the Southern Amateur League is its stability and the longevity of its member clubs. We are fortunate to be able to say that of the 40 open-aged member clubs in the competition for season 2021-2022, no less than fifteen have been members since before World War II. Three of those have been in continuous membership since before World War I – including founders, Allyn Old Boys – and two more – Civil Service and Crouch End Vampires – are founder members who played elsewhere after World War I but returned to the fold in 1928, remaining ever since. These statistics would be impressive in professional football but at amateur level they are truly extraordinary. In this section we celebrate the nine clubs (so far) who have achieved one hundred years (or more) of membership of the League.

The Southern Amateur League was formed in 1907 by the same movers and shakers who formed the Amateur Football Association (now the Alliance). This occurred due to the *Great Split* between professionals and amateurs in which the three Metropolitan county associations of London, Middlesex and Surrey broke with the Football Association after being instructed to accept professional clubs into their ranks. London soon returned to the fold which is why many of London's professional clubs have affiliated with the London FA rather than any of the other FAs.

The complaint the Metropolitan county associations (and clubs and players) had was that amateur football should be governed by amateurs, for amateurs and that the instruction from on high that professionals be admitted to the amateur county associations was the straw that broke the camel's back.

The SAL was originally intended to be one of a number of regional amateur leagues whose champions would play-off for the title of National Amateur Champion but this did not come to pass. The League itself, however, was hugely successful with games drawing large crowds and reports of matches appearing in a wide range of newspapers and sporting journals, such as *The Globe*:

THE GLOBE, MONDAY, SEPTEMBER 2, 1907:

For the coming season quite a healthy state of existence will be shown. An excellent entry has been received for a competition run on cup-tie lines for a trophy presented by the Corinthians. The Southern Amateur League has been formed in two sections, comprising the following clubs:—Section I.: Casuals, Civil Service, Croydon, Ealing, Eastbourne, Ipswich, New Crusaders, Richmond Association, and Townley Park. Section II.: Allyn, Bowes Park, Chess-hunt, Crouch End Vampires, Hampstead, Lee, Reigate Priory, and Weybridge. Associations have been formed in Surrey and Middlesex in connection with which senior and junior county cup competitions are being instituted, and the sweet cause of charity, competitions for which are also being arranged, will remain a strong feature in their programme.

There are a few familiar names in that article, and not just current SAL members.

Its teams have completed a combined total of 518 seasons, playing 9,840 matches and winning 4,380. They have scored 22,688 league goals and won 55 league titles.

Saints and Winners:

The story of St. James' Old Boys



Lawrence O'Leary and Shaun O'Sullivan

2022 has been a significant year in the history of St. James' Old Boys. Saturday 26th March 2022 will be a date that the players and supporters of St. James' Old Boys will remember forever. It was the date that the club won their first ever piece of competitive silverware with a 5-0 victory after extra time against Old Finchleians 4s in the final of the SAL Minor Cup. The Junior Division 2 North title followed two weeks later with an unbeaten league season in the process to complete a remarkable and truly historic season for the club. Such lofty achievements felt a million miles away during the first season of the club in the Southern Amateur league; the 2015/2016 season. The transformation of the club from 2015 to the modern day has been phenomenal. The club has had to endure many brutal defeats and a high turnover of players to get to the point we are at now where we are winning silverware. It has been a challenging journey with four players that have been part of the journey at the start and part of the most successful season in the history of the club in 2021/2022. Those four players are Lawrence O'Leary, Charlie McNally, Aaron McElwee and Shaun O'Sullivan. Shaun is the secretary of the club and has been a major driving force in transforming the club from the whipping boys of Junior Division 3 in 2015/2016 to double winners in 2021/2022. Shaun has put his heart and soul in to organising the club and recruiting many excellent players for the club. We now have four competitive teams at the club. SJOB seemed like a lost cause six years ago. To put into context, the extent of the transformation, I will go into some detail about the state that the club were in when Shaun took over the management of the club in 2015.

My first game for the club was away to Old Westminster Citizens 3rd in a cup game and I will always remember the car journey to the game had two very interesting characters. We had a centre back that bought a 4 pack of cans of Stella Artois from the local Tesco and to my horror he was drinking the cans in the car on the way to the game. He was also smoking a couple of joints. Not surprisingly, he was unable to run after the first five minutes of the game. We had another player making his debut the same day who claimed to have had trials at Benfica. His first touch of the game made it very clear that he was nowhere near the level of Junior Division 3 of the Southern Amateur League, never mind Benfica. Those players were quickly discarded from the squad.

The team were competitive in many of the home games at St James' School. The pitch was a grass pitch that was an absolute bog of a pitch in wet conditions. Two of the three victories we had in the first season were at home. We had a few narrow defeats at home. The team were able to field a full eleven and subs for all the home games. What was a major challenge for the team in the first season was the away games with many of the away games being played in south London. For many of the games, we were unable to field a full eleven and had to resort to asking friends of friends to play. Many of the players who were kind enough to help the team, were unfortunately not of the required quality to make the team competitive in most of the away matches. Inevitably, we experienced severe defeats. Two of the defeats we had were games we conceded double figures. We lost 13-0 to Nottsborough 4s and 10-0 away to South Bank Cuaco 3s. In both games we started with 9 men.

To put into perspective, how challenging the away games were for the club in the first season, in the game away to South Bank Cuaco we started the game with 9 men and a tenth player was due to be part of the team. He turned up to the dressing room during the first half, looked at the horrendous weather conditions outside and decided to stay in the dressing room for the remainder of the game. We ended up losing the game 10-0 and the player that stayed in the dressing room tucked into the post-match hospitality on offer after the game without any shame in leaving his teammates battle in difficult conditions against a team with 2 extra men.

Unsurprisingly we finished bottom of Junior Division 3 in 2015/2016. Our other two teams also had a similar fate. The summer of 2016 brought progress for the club in recruiting some young, technically good players. We won a pre-season trophy and were much more competitive in 16/17. We finished 4th in Intermediate division 3 and our 2s were competitive in their league but it did feel like 2 clubs within a club.

In 2019, we decided to keep with our two teams and recruit heavily with lads mainly from an Irish background, these have been the catalyst to growing and growing. Our recruitment policy is that you can only join the club as an individual or group of two so there are no cliques and everyone is in the same position when they grow. The culture is fantastic and we can truly call ourselves a club of 4 teams where we all socialise together.

In 2020, we went from 2 teams to 4 teams, and it has been a joy to witness this growth. We cannot thank Mark Freedman and the LMC for all the help they provided us at the start and the guidance they gave us to really become successful. We had to take a step back to move forward 4 steps!

The culture of the club wasn't right for a few years, and we have done a great job in recruiting, not just quality players, we have also recruited the right characters for the dressing room that have a strong work ethic in addition to their excellent Football ability. The recruits over recent years have completed the jigsaw. We now have very talented teams, all with a very solid spine. Our 1s have great balance of technical quality, with physically and mentally tough players through the spine of the team and lightning pace and prolific goal scorers up front. There is a strong team spirit which has led to this historic success for the club! We look forward to all 4 of our teams obtaining success in the near future.

The next step is obtaining new facilities at Copthall as what we currently have are simply not good enough.

Hopefully we get this soon so the club can grow and grow while staying affordable for all.

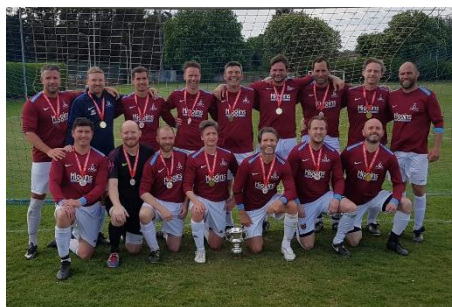

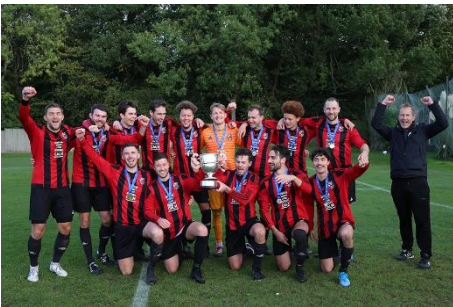

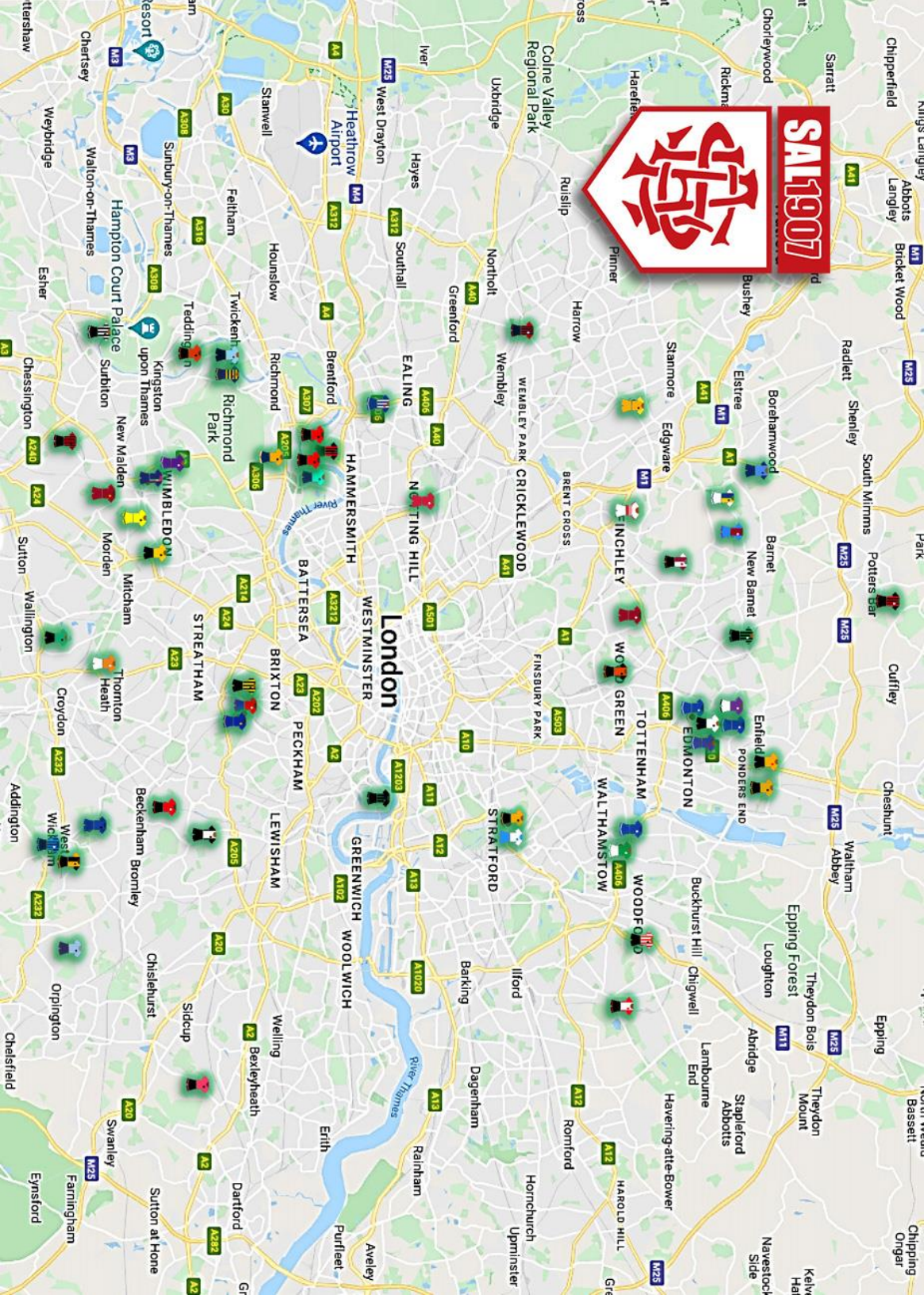
