## An Introduction to the Inter-League Cup

The FA Inter-League Cup is now in seventh edition having been introduced as the FA National League System Cup in 2003 to determine the England representative at the UEFA Regions Cup. For the 1999 and 2003 Regions Cups (England did not enter in 2001) the FA nominated the Mid-Cheshire League (now the Cheshire League) and the Kent County League respectively but from the 2005 edition onwards UEFA insisted that teams must win a domestic competition in order to qualify.

The NLS Cup was founded with league primarily at Step 7 in the National League System as this was thought to be the highest level at which most players were eligible to play (players must not be, or ever have been, under contract in football). Since then the competition has grown to include leagues like the SAL who play outside of the system. These leagues have thrived with the SAL winning the competition at the first attempt in 2008, the Isle of Man League winning twice and the Jersey Combination and Guersey Priaulx League (now the Guernsey Senior County League) both winning once each. Indeed, the Mid-Cheshire League's win in 2004 is the only one to date by a league within the 'System.
